1. Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) Exempt benefits (included in our Gold and Platinum packages)

A number of benefits are exempt from FBT. The following work-related items are exempt benefits:

- a portable electronic device
- a PDA, calculator or electronic diary
- a laptop (including iPads)
- an item of computer software
- a briefcase

The work-related items exemption is limited to:

- items primarily for work-related use (you will need to give a declaration stating this)
- one item per FBT year (currently 01 April to 31 March) for items that have a substantially identical function, unless the item is a replacement item.
- 2. Superannuation (included in our Silver, Gold and Platinum packages)

Salary sacrificed superannuation contributions under an effective salary sacrifice arrangement are considered to be employer contributions which, when paid for an employee to a complying superannuation fund, are not fringe benefits.

The current limit is \$25,000 per annum, including the statutory Superannuation Guarantee Charge. You may contribute more on an after tax basis.

- 3. Airlines lounge memberships (included in our Gold and Platinum packages)
- 4. Income protection insurance (included in our Gold and Platinum packages)
- 5. Professional memberships and subscriptions (included in our Gold and Platinum packages)
- 6. Fringe benefits (included in our Platinum package)

Common fringe benefits include:

- Cars, normally through a novated lease
- expense payments (such as the payment of your loan repayments, school fees, child care costs and home phone costs).
